Stephen Winters MD '70

He is the son of Holocaust survivors who immigrated to the United States post World War II. He grew up in a loving home, but in his early years in school, he was a marginal student, lacking self-confidence and not sure of his future. Today, the good doctor is director and founder (1991) of the cardiac rhythm management program at the Gagnon Cardiovascular Institute, Morristown (NJ) Medical Center. He is an associate professor of medicine at the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey and serves on the Board of Directors of the Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Association (HCMA). Previously, Dr. Winters served as co-director of the electrophysiology division at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine and on the faculty at Mount Sinai and at Columbia's College of Physicians and Surgeons.

Ask him what brought about the change in him, and he will take you back to 1967 when he started as a sophomore at De Witt Clinton. "With everlasting appreciation to stimulating teachers, I quickly moved from regular to all honors classes and graduated number six in my class in 1970. Of all my Clinton experiences, I am most indebted to Ms. Ada Chirles who taught me how to ask questions, seek answers, and write, while she mentored me to achieve the position of editor-in-chief of the Clinton News. She and numerous other teachers motivated me to learn, while instilling in me a sense of self-esteem, which I had not previously experienced." In special tribute to Ms. Chirles, he supports a Clinton scholarship fund in her honor.

Dr. Winters and his wife Rachelle, a speech pathologist, are the proud parents of three children, who have grown up hearing many stories about De Witt Clinton High School. As the good doctor says, "While others may admirably speak of their Harvard, Yale, or prep school days, I enjoy singing the praises of De Witt Clinton High School, its teachers, its alumni, its history, and its humanity."



Denise Wallen-Grant '90

Since 2020, she has been senior director of business transformation & acceleration for Tapestry, a global house of brands that unites the magic of Coach, Kate Spade, and Stuart Weitzman. She did not arrive at that position overnight. It came from thirty years of experience in sales, store management, product development, merchandise & assortment planning & allocation. She became uniquely skilled in inventory management across wholesale, retail, outlet, and E-commerce channels, as well as driving employee engagement and sales growth.

Denise Wallen-Grant began her career in the fashion industry working in retail stores while pursuing her Bachelor of Arts in science/sociology from Columbia University. In 1994, with degree in hand, she moved to the corporate side of the industry, where she earned her credentials at The Gap, Polo Ralph Lauren, Ann Taylor, the Jones Group and Onestop Internet.

In 2017, Wallen-Grant joined Coach North America as senior director retail allocation. At Coach, she had the unique opportunity to be featured in a video that was part biographical and part discussion on efforts to expand diversity in corporations. About working at Coach, she says to her CEO, "Here, the culture is pretty diverse and everyone's kind and welcoming. But I inherited my team, and when I had the opportunity to hire, I definitely sought out diversity." She adds, "In the stores and lower-level individual contributors, you see a lot of diversity, but as you work your way up through the ranks — middle management, executive leadership, senior leadership — it begins to dissipate a little bit. So, I think there's a lot of opportunity there." There is a precious moment in the video when asked if she had changed anything about herself to be part of the corporate world. She smiles and says yes. She had to leave her Bronx talk in the Bronx and develop the sophisticated speech of leadership.

Samuel Aaron Garnes '92

The urge to play football may not have been on his mind at birth, on July 7, 1974. But growing up in the Bronx exposed Samuel Aaron Garnes to the game he would come to love. Playing for DeWitt Clinton High School, he led the Governors to the Bronx PSAL football title in 1991. The next stop was the University of Cincinnati, where he excelled for the Bearcats as star safety with 318 tackles.

In 1997, the New York Giants selected Garnes in the fifth round of the NFL draft. During his five seasons playing defensive for the Giants (1997-2001), he missed only six games and started 77 of the 78 games in which he played. He was credited with more than 250 tackles and intercepted six passes. One highlight as a Giant took place off the field. In 2000, he was inducted into the Bronx Walk of Fame, his plaque forever affixed to a corner lamppost on the Grand Concourse. The following year brought another honor—participating in Super Bowl XXXV. He had five solo tackles as the Giants'

starting safety, but the ultimate honor of the 34-7 victory went to the Baltimore Ravens. In 2002, free agency gave Garnes the opportunity to play two seasons for the team he supported in his youth—the New York Jets. He started all 24 games with the Jets before hanging up his cleats in 2004.

Retirement could not really end Sam Garnes's love to be part of the game. He would coach. Knowing he still had much to learn, Garnes began as the defensive coordinator at Emerson (N.J.) High School in 2005 before coaching the defensive backs of the Cologne Centurions in NFL Europe in 2006 and the Las Vegas Locomotives in the UFL in 2009. Then good fortune came his way when his old Giants coach John Fox became coach of the Carolina Panthers in 2010. Fox hired Garnes to be assistant special teams coach and when Fox turned to coaching the Denver Broncos the next season, he brought Garnes with him as an assistant secondary coach. Following his four years with the Broncos, Garnes finished his second career with two years as assistant defensive backs coach with the Chicago Bears.

In September 2018, Garnes joined NY Sports Day as a football columnist, writing a weekly column on the NFL. In 2019, he became a sports analyst on the nationally syndicated radio program, The Ryan Show FM. But even before those two ventures, he was eager to become involved with improving the lives of youngsters through sports. In July 2018, he had established the Sam Garnes Foundation "to teach youth about character building, leadership skills, and career insights with sports being the anchor." As part of his activities, Garnes still goes to different area high schools to work with the football teams. But he also knows the importance...excuse the attempted humor...of having a real job. In January 2021, he incorporated R&S Nationwide Transport LLC, a freight shipping trucking Company headquartered in Fort Lee, New Jersey. Making his home in North Jersey, Garnes has a daughter, Alivia, whom he deeply loves. She will graduate from Arizona State in spring 2022 with a Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies.

For all his enterprise on and off the field and in the business world, the compliment most often made about Sam Garnes is that he is a gentleman, grateful for what he has and generous with sharing it with others. DeWitt Clinton High School is proud to declare him a distinguished alumnus.



Michael Blake '00

Born in the Bronx of Jamaican parents on Christmas Day 1982, Michael Blake was already committed to a life serving others by the time he was elected president of the 2000 senior class at DeWitt Clinton High School. After graduation, it was off to the very prestigious Medill Journalism School at Northwestern University (Illinois), where he earned a degree in broadcast journalism before embarking on a career in public service. He started as an intern in the Illinois State Senate, then managed winning state legislative races in Michigan before holding critical senior staff positions on President Barack Obama's 2008 and 2012 campaigns. The president even went on record to say that he would not have won the 2008 election without Blake's tireless work in key Midwest states. The prestige of working at the White House was Blake's reward. He became associate director of public engagement and the deputy associate director of the Office

of Intergovernmental Affairs, holding both positions simultaneously. In November 2012, President Obama was re-elected. Following the inauguration ceremony in January 2013, Blake left White House service to become a senior advisor at Operation HOPE, a nonprofit that teaches young people and families in the Bronx about sound financial practices. At the same time, he thought to expand the work of Operation HOPE by forming Atlas Strategy Group, giving it the motto "Bringing Equity and Justice to Scale." His experiences offered a wide range of potential clients including Washington Commanders, National Democratic Training Committee, Monroe College, Harlem Globetrotters, Promise and Operation HOPE.

The call to political service led to Blake's 2014 election to the New York State Assembly from the 79th District in the South Bronx (and re-election in 2016 and 2018). He spent his three terms advocating for people. He helped create jobs by getting small and minority/women owned business enterprises contracts with New York State, getting senior citizens heat in their homes, and training millennials in politics. Until 2021, Blake continued to serve as a vice chair at large of the Democratic National Committee, a position he had held since 2017.

Currently as the CEO of Atlas Strategy Group, Blake has increased the group's efforts to provide strategic counsel to organizations and forward-thinking executives eager to achieve a more equitable world. As a licensed minister, he also preaches as an exhorter in the African Methodist Episcopal Church and a certified lay speaker in the United Methodist Church. Whatever the audience, Blake's guiding principle remains the same: Your Block won't Block your Blessings. Your Zip code won't deny your Destiny.

Joel Martinez '01 (The Kid Mero)



Our honoree is a writer, comedian, music blogger, and a YouTube and Twitter personality, whose career owes much to the Internet and the electronic tools of communication that are part of it. Of Dominican background, his first language was Spanish, but a few years of watching "Saved by the Bell" introduced him to English. His father wanted to name him Romero. His mother wanted Joel. If you knew him at DeWitt Clinton, you know that his mother won out. Young Martinez loved DeWitt Clinton High School. Though he never played on any of the school's athletic teams, he took every advantage of the school's courts and fields to play a variety of sports, at the same time maintaining good academic grades. He also enjoyed making his classmates and teachers laugh. Some would say he was a bit of a clown, but he would have the last laugh as he turned his comic skills into a career that has brought him great fame. That he did not go too far over the top with his humor at school, he gives much credit to two

faculty members, Bert Blanco and Howard Langley '81, who inspired him to make good choices in life.

Martinez studied at Hunter College for a year and a half, but the illness of his father forced him to leave school and get a job to help the family. He became a messenger for a law firm and hoped that someday he could become a paralegal. In 2012, he began writing for Vice's music platform Noisey. However, his first article for them was published online on November 14, 2012; it was a review of Canadian electronic music duo Crystal Castles' album III. Then his love of making people laugh got in the way. At a comedy club, he stepped up to the open mike and gave the audience ample opportunity to roar with laughter. One night the owner of the club called to him to do his routine, "Kid, you're on." The kid got an idea. He shortened the name his father had wanted to give him and became The Kid Mero.

But limiting himself to just being funny was not enough for The Kid Mero. He had a lot to say, and he knew another Bronxite, of Jamaican background, who had a lot to say, an old friend Daniel Baker. They became a team and, of course, Baker needed a new name and came up with Desus Nice. Their adventures began with Twitter and led to gigs on Complex and MTV, the creation of the ongoing "Bodega Boys" podcast in 2015 and a daily late-night show on Viceland that racked up a loyal following across its over 300 episodes before moving to Showtime with the show "Desus & Mero." Their self-help book, "God-Level Knowledge Darts: Life Lessons From the Bronx," was released by Random House last September 2020 and made the New York Times Best Seller list.

The Kid Mero presently lives in New Jersey with his wife Heather and four children (three girls and a boy). Don't worry. New Jersey will never take the Bronx out of the kid.
