

Principal's Letter

September/October 2023

Dear DWC Alumni,

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome all of you to the 2023-2024 school year at DeWitt Clinton High School. I am proud to report that this past June we had a 97% graduation rate, the highest ever recorded for DeWitt Clinton. We are one of only eight schools in districts 8, 10 and 11 that are part of the 90/90 club, meaning we have over 90% graduation rate and 90% attendance. As we begin a new school year, I want everyone to keep this number in mind because this is our goal from now until the end of year.

There are many new and exciting initiatives happening at DWC that I want to share with you:

• In order for students to be successful in school, the first step is being present and on time. Our goal is always to have a 90% attendance rate or higher. To this end we will be offering a new attendance initiative through the use of DWC branded apparel.

• Students who achieve their attendance goals each month will receive free DWC apparel. This includes:

- DWC Nike Tech Suits

- DWC Fear of God Hoodie & Jogger

• We are expanding our CTE programming this year to include a Nursing Pathway and Business Pathway. Students will have the opportunity to be taught by two licensed nurses with the ability to receive their Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) certification for students who successfully complete the coursework. For those who are in the Business course this will include practical lessons from quickbooks, and accounting. Students who successfully complete this course will receive college credit through Mercy College.

• After many conversations with our Student Government, we will be expanding the number of clubs that are offered at DeWitt Clinton. Students will have the opportunity to suggest and apply for a new club to be formed, so long as they have a teacher who is willing to serve as their supervisor. Clubs being suggested include: swimming club, video game club (computer science classes are building gaming computers in September), fitness club, ping pong club, boxing club, and more.

• In an effort to boost student morale and athletics we have revamped one of our weight training spaces and have created a game room. This room has air hockey, table tennis, boxing equipment, and new PRX and Gladiator walls. This is state of the art technology that will allow all students to participate in physical activity regardless of their fitness level.

• In that same effort, we have also converted an old locker room into 3 indoor batting cages. The only school in the Bronx with this many indoor cages will allow our softball and baseball teams to have a leg up on their competition. This will also be a space where P.E. classes will be held so that students can learn the games of softball and baseball.

certainly not least, it is my honor to report that the historical pool at DeWitt Clinton is back open for business. We will be bringing back our Boys and Girls Swim teams and we will use the space for students to become certified lifeguards, adding another opportunity for our students to find gainful employment while in high school and be productive members of the community.

I look forward to greeting each of you during the school year.





Victor R. Fuchs '40 was the "Dean" of health care economists. In his book *Who Shall Live? Health, Economics and Social Chance*, he was among the first to articulate in clear, layman's prose why the United Sates was in the midst of rapidly rising health care costs. Victor served in the U. S. Army during World War II, graduated from NYU, and in 1978 joined Stanford Univer-

sity as a full-time professor. Victor Fuchs passed away at Stanford on September 16, 2023.



Martin Halpern '46 was an accomplished poet, playwright, and composer. He earned a B.A. from the University of Rochester and a Ph.D. in English from Harvard. Joining the Theater Arts faculty at Brandeis University, he taught playwriting and dramatic literature for 29 years. Martin Halpern died September 10, 2023.



James E. Hess '49 graduated from CCNY, then served in the U. S. Army as a first lieutenant in Korea in the 1950's. He joined the NYC Board of Education in 1954. After serving as a teacher for 34 years, he rose to the position of supervisor for special education in CSD 5. John always followed DWC sports.

He passed away on November 29, 2022.

Sam Gross '50 used his wit and drawing talent to become a world-renowned cartoonist. His work appeared in *The New Yorker, Esquire, Cosmopolitan,* and *Good Housekeeping.* He was also the cartoon editor of *National Lampoon* and *Parents Magazine.* His cartoon collections include *I am Blind and My Dog is Dead*

(1977), An Elephant is Soft and Mushy (1980), and Your Mother is a Remarkable Woman (1992). In the late 1990s, Gross became involved in electronic publishing ventures with cartoons playing an important role.

Sam Gross passed away on May 6, 2023.



Jerome Moss '53 could boast that he received the largest first-place purse to date in the Kentucky Derby when his horse Giacomo unexpectedly won the race in 2005. His horse Zenyatta is the all-time leading female earner in North America. Moss also had a winner when he and musician Herb Albert founded A&M Records

Jerome Moss passed away on August 16, 2023.




Alvin "Al" Harvin '55 braved new worlds when he became the first African-American reporter for the *New York Post* in 1967. Two years later he became a sportswriter for the *New York Times* and remained with the paper until his retirement in 1994. His insightful reporting on the New York Giants and Jets made him a respected name in jour-

nalism, but when he covered DWC football, it was a special treat for Clintonites young and old.

Alvin Harvin passed away on April 9, 2023.

Mel Smorra '58 was a Roosevelt, Yonkers and Meadowlands harness racing trainer. He developed his love for horses at Van Cortland Park. From 1962 to 1980, Mel was the head trainer at the John Chapman Stable, then opened his own public stable. He trained many great horses, including Delmonica Hanover and Savoir, both world champions.

Mel Smorra died at 82 on September 27, 2023.


